The University of Maryland School of Pharmacy is offering a two-year post PharmD fellowship in geriatric pharmacotherapy. The purpose of the program is to develop competency and expertise in:

- collaborative inter-professional geriatric practice and applied research;
- the scientific research process, including hypothesis generation and development, study design, protocol development, grantsmanship, study coordination, data collection, analysis and interpretation, technical skills development, presentation of results, and manuscript preparation and publication and
- academic experience in geriatric pharmacotherapy curriculum.

Under the close direction, instruction and supervision of a qualified investigator-mentor, the fellow receives a highly individualized learning experience. A fellowship graduate will be capable of independently and collaboratively conducting research and functioning as a principal investigator.
