



Oregon Patient Safety
Commission Advocating
for Anticoagulation
Stewardship Programs



Reports of anticoagulant-related patient harms submitted through **Oregon's Patient Safety Reporting Program** (PSRP) have led the State's Patient Safety Commission to promote the adoption of Anticoagulation Stewardship Programs through use of the ACF/NQF resource, **Advancing Anticoagulation Stewardship: A Playbook**. The PSRP reports having received 62 medication events that involved anticoagulants, half of which

resulted in serious harm or death. Oregon facilities estimated that 77% of the events were could have been prevented.

PSPR reports provide evidence that Oregon facilities are already making headway with one core element from the *Playbook*: Secure administrative leadership commitment. One recommendation for establishing an antibiotic stewardship program is "Share actual cases of patient harm within the organization to raise awareness, create urgency, and gain buyin." 94% (58/62) of medication event reports that involved anticoagulants included participation by senior management in event analysis. Anticoagulation Forum members are encouraged to engage safety commissions and other relevant organizations in their states to promote adverse event reporting and advocate for Anticoagulation Stewardship Program adoption.
